### **STUNTING**

Progress towards World Health Assembly (WHA) Global Nutrition **stunting target.** 



- Prevalence of stunting among children under five years fell between 2012 and 2022 but remains *very high*.
- Rates in Pakistan remain above the UN regional average for Southern Asia.
- Despite progress, Pakistan remains off-track from the WHA target for child stunting, with a **gap of 6.8** between projection and target.

Figure 1: Under-five stunting prevalence, Pakistan, 2005-2022 and projected to 2025



#### OVERWEIGHT

Progress towards World Health Assembly (WHA) Global Nutrition overweight target.



- Prevalence of overweight among children under five years old fell between 2012 and 2022, remaining at a low level.
- Rates in Pakistan have gone from above to slightly below the UN regional average for Southern Asia.
- Pakistan is on-track to meet the WHA target for child overweight, and to decrease from low to very low levels, with projected 2025 rate 2.3 below target.

Figure 2: Under-five overweight prevalence, Pakistan, 2005-2022 and projected to 2025


